Wow what a trade! A good entry forward as expected for early October and after the recent weather. Overall it would be very mixed in terms of quality with several runs of cattle coming straight off grass. It's fair to say we've had an electric trade from start to finish for all grades! Some buyers have gone home disappointed after expecting to be able to purchase within their price range, but a packed ringside led to fierce bidding throughout.

More bulls forward than recently with a real range of quality and age. Pick of the bunch was a 9 month Hereford bull at £830 from RG&EA Cornes, Crewe. Next were 11 month Friesian bulls at £720

from Mr R.E. Brittain, Bromsgrove and 7 month Limousin from R&K. Jones, Chirbury sold for £680. Younger types topped at £630 for 4mo Blue bulls from Rooms Farm Ltd, Adderley and 5 month Simmentals at £610 from R&K. Jones.

Onto the steers which were a fast trade and included majority 6 month plus types which topped at £905 for a 9 month Charolais from J. Frizell Agri, Crewe. Next up were 7 month Angus at £890 from EG Dyke & Son, Stafford. Very few younger models forward which topped at £730 for 5 month Stabiliser from C.E. Hancock & Son, Elton and £720 for 6 month Herefords from RG.&EA. Cornes, 5 month Angus from Mr J.M. Forrester, Stafford made £690 and 5 month Blues sold to £640 from Mr M.A. Nicholls, Uttoxeter. Anything with shape and shine £550 to £750 no matter of the breed.

The heifers have been a very strong trade with very little for under £450. The Blue heifers were particularly well sold today. Top call going to 10 month Herefords from RG.&EA. Cornes at £780, 9 month Charolais at £720 from J Frizell Agri and 7 month Blue heifers at £690 from Mr M.A. Nicholls.

Younger heifers sold to £640 for 5 month Blues from Mr J. Redfern, Tamworth and 5 month Angus topped at £595 from Mr M.A. Nicholls. Several bunches of 4 to 6 month old natives today which traded at £450 to £550 for the best types.

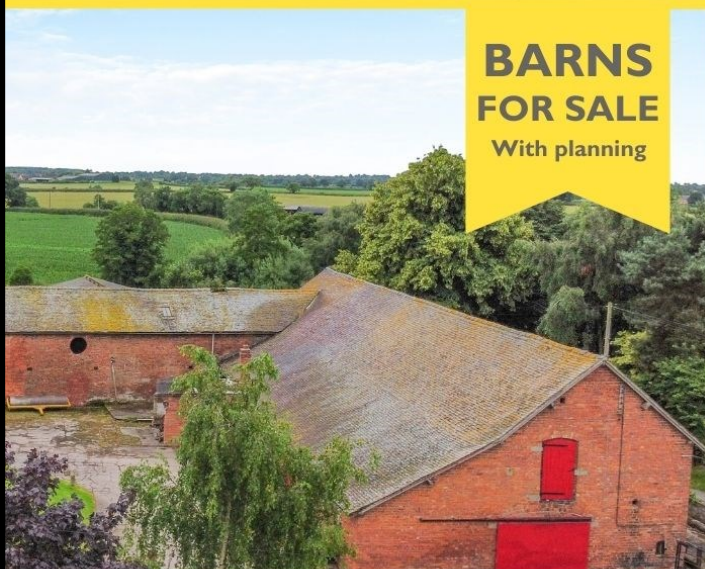
