Great to see numbers increasing and a big thank you to all our vendors both near and far for your support. Seasonality seems to be drawing more cattle to the market place and trade seems to be absorbing them well and still buoyancy within the trade. Again a very seasonal entry forward with a large proportion of leaner and plainer types forward but this said demand extremely brisk for leaner cows at present.

Headline acts returned at 248p or £2,112.76 for overage clean, 236p or £1,900.80 for sucklers, 230p or £1,594.08 for dairy and 180p or £1,395.20 for bulls. The overall market average returned at 165p.

113 Dairies - Reasonable number forward for the time of year and finding a brisk trade throughout. Young meated cattle still finding a premium selling to 230p (£1,472.00) for black and white from Mr David Holt & Family, Middlewich and further cows to 190p (£1,406.00), 186p (£1,342.92), 184p (£1,368.96) etc. PA.JE.J.
