NEW** MINISTER ANNOUNCES NEW ROLE IN THE TENANT FARMING SECTOR

At last weeks Northern Farming Conference, Minister Daniel Zeichner announced the creation of a Commissioner role for the tenant farming sector in England, the first of its kind!

The role aims to:

- I. Advocate for tenant farmers, landlords, and advisors
- 2. Promote fair practices and improve relationships
- 3. Mediate disputes confidentially
- 4. Support sustainable, collaborative farming in line with the Agricultural Landlord and Tenant Code of Practice

The Commissioner, appointed by Defra, will provide updates on sector trends and guidance. Recruitment opens soon, with a planned start by spring 2025.
